As part of the Labor Day Weekend, This Saturday night, September 5th, The All American Speedway in Roseville, Ca. is the only place to be as Championships are on the line in every one of our Premiere Divisions.

If you have put off coming out to the Speedway this season, you don't want to miss a single minute of exciting local racing action the next two weeks! That's right just two weeks of Point's racing remain!

In the NASCAR Whelen All American Series Late Model Division, the National Points have finally come out! All eyes will be on Cameron Park's Jason Romero (#8). Romero is ranked 9th in the country (-127), 2nd in the State of California (-91), and leads the Points at AAS by 66 over Granite Bay's John Moore (#27) and 70 over Orangevale's Gary Glenn (#50).

Within this Division, Jake Gomes (#16X) of Manteca is the leading rookie candidate in the country. Gomes is ranked 30th. Pine Grove's Matt Scott (#35), yet another talented young Late Model driver at AAS, is ranked 38th, just 30 points behind Gomes as they both contend for Rookie of the Year honors.

This Saturday night, the Late Models will be competing in two separate Toyota/TRD 50 Lap races. That means twice the extremely valuable points will be up for grabs! All the best cars will be at All American Speedway!

In the Whelen All American Modified Division, Roseville's Jarred Beddow (#50) suffered a horrific throttle-sticking collision with the wall in Turn 3 last week. Beddow was sore but OK. Extensive damage was done to the car of the Point's Leader and a DNF was his result for the night. Beddow has assured us that he will return to battle in his quest for the Championship. Beddow's lead is 26 over Lincoln's Nick Lyons (#43). With two races to go, Lyons is not mathematically out of this. To have any hope though, he will have to win!

In the Street Stock Division, defending Champion Mickey Owens (#08) of Elverta once again sits atop the point's leads. His lead is a slim 8 points over Loomis' Christopher Lambert (#50) and 45 over Mickey's brother Kevin Owens (#21) of Sacramento. This has been one of the most highly contested battles between three great drivers we've been fortunate enough to watch as race fans.

Also on the bill will be the Junior Focus' and their high speed action and thrills!

Gates will open at 4pm with qualifying shortly thereafter. Racing begins at 6pm.
