## **Championship Wars Continue at All American Speedway**

Fresh off from a successful kids night the weekly NASCAR racing series will shift to the first rain makeup date of the season this Saturday night July 23<sup>rd</sup>. Championship point's race #6 was rained out in June when Roseville witnessed unusual rainy weather. Joining the showcase this Saturday night will be the NASCAR Late Models 100, Modifieds 40, Street Stocks and Bombers 35. Moving half way through the season the Championship battles continue to be heated as drivers are eager to provide solid finishes to capture the 2011 All American Speedway Championship.

Matt Scott looks to continue his points lead piloting the No. 35 Karp Capital NASCAR Late Model. The 2010 track champion holds a total of 212 point over the competition with four feature wins. However, Jason Romero who missed a race that hurt his point's standings is still trying to catch up to Scott with only 45 points from the top spot. The 2009 track champion pilots the No. 8 Folsom Lake Asphalt Late Model holds five feature wins. Juan Pitta holds onto the third spot with 146 points and is only 21 points from second. Pitta pilots the No. 11 El Patron Bar and Grill Late Model holds five top five finishes for the 2011 season. Chris Scribner seizes the fourth spot with 126 points piloting the No. 5 "Duck" Quick Quack Car Wash Late Model with seven top five finishes this season. Dylan Hutchison is tied with Scribner for the fourth spot. The Rookie Driver pilots the No. 88 Johnnie Walker Performance Center Late Model holds six top five finishes this year. Jamie Krizysik made a jump from the 11 position to gain three spots landing the eighth position. The Canadian Rookie Driver has missed six races but provides solid finishes to earn a top ten spot.

There are minor changes in the Bomber division with Chris Paulson still leading the way in points. Paulson continues his points lead with 217 points over the competition. Paulson pilots the No. 3 Body Bazzare Bomber with four feature wins this season. In the second spot is Erick Ray with 173 points just 44 points from first. Ray pilots the No. 77 Allied Bail Bonds Bomber holds one feature win and six top five finishes. Matt Camp sits in the third position with 145 points only 28 points from second. Camp pilots the No. 52 Sacramento Black Rifle Bomber holds one feature win and five top five finishes. Richard Perez seizes the fourth position with 134 points piloting the No. 50 Vic's Tools Yellow Bomber holds six top five finishes this season. Joe Rhodes holds onto the fifth position with 110 points piloting the No. 63 orange machine and possesses three top five finishes.

The new points leader in the Modified division is Dan Jinkerson, who regains the lead from Scott Winters with 207 points. Jinkerson pilots the No. 29 yellow and silver Modified holds two feature wins and five

top five finishes this year. Scott Winters holding tight to his second position with 190 points just 17 points from first. Winters pilots the No. 24 Ferrari Farms Modified captured four feature wins this season. Closing in on Winters is Rookie Driver Steve Cote in third with 184 points only six points from Winters and 23 points from first. The Canadian driver pilots the No. 4 Allstar Performance Modified holds two consecutive feature wins this season. In the fourth position is Andy Field with 142 points only 42 points from third. Field took a year off and returned this year piloting the No. 8 FM Equipment Services Modified holds five top five finishes this year. Jason Bamberg sits in the fifth spot with 136 points driving the No. 5 black and checkered flag Modified holds three top five finishes this season.

Mickey Owens looks to continue his championship points lead with 222 points over the competition. Owens piloting the No. 08 Full Spectrum Ink Street Stock holds two feature wins and five top five finishes this season. Richard Poppert Jr. sits in the second position with 198 points just 24 points from the leader. Poppert pilots the No. 23 Coors Light Street Stock has two feature wins and five top five finishes. In third is Chris Lambert with 196 points merely two points from Poppert. Lambert pilots the No. 50 Karp Capital Street Stock has gripped four feature wins this season. Byron Gonzales securing the fourth spot with 186 points driving the No. 98 Matco Tools Street Stock captured five top five finishes this year. In the fifth spot is Dave Silva with 172 points piloting the No. 86 flaming blue and green Street Stock holds five top five finishes this season.

On Saturday July 23rd the grandstands gate will open at 4pm with qualifying around 4pm and racing at 6pm. Pit passes will be available for purchase to the public at 2 pm. The drivers meeting is scheduled for 5pm.

Adult tickets cost \$13 on Saturday with Seniors and Juniors 6-15 \$7 and Children 6 and under free. Family passes are \$35 including two adults and three junior's tickets. Parking is \$5 per vehicle. Special discounts are available for dedicated race fans with a 10 pack of parking passes for \$30. Save \$20 on parking and passes are good for ALL Fairground Events year long! More ticket information is available by calling (916) 786-2025.
