DURAN CALLS COMMUNITY FORUM ON SPEEDWAY “AN IMPORTANT FIRST STEP”

Event brings together neighbors, community leaders, merchants, and racing enthusiasts

Roseville, CA - After hosting an August 15th Community Forum that brought together neighbors, community leaders, merchants and racing enthusiasts to discuss noise issues at the All American Speedway in Roseville, First District Placer County Supervisor Jack Duran issued the following statement:

“I want to thank all residents and stakeholders for taking part in what was a very lively and worthwhile discussion. I believe that open communication is the key to effective problem solving and last night’s forum was an important first step for all concerned stakeholders.
